

Pirates of the Caribbean Star 'Pintel' joins shipmate in '1066'

Lee Arenberg, pirate 'Pintel' in the blockbuster Pirates of the Caribbean franchise joins his old shipmate Martin Klebba as Robert Champart the first Norman Archbishop of Canterbury in the eagerly awaited epic '1066'. This historically accurate portrayal of the events that lead to the great battle at Hastings between Oliver! star Mark Lester's King Harold II and the as yet uncast William the Conqueror is the most ambitious independent UK movie ever attempted.

Arenberg has appeared in more than 30 movies and countless television series including the Star Trek spin off Voyager, Pushing Daisies and Seinfeld.
